Community Partnership for Homeless Offers Homeless Children Nutrition Program

Miami, Fla —August 30, 2005— Community Partnership for Homeless today announced the sponsorship of the Homeless Children Nutrition Program, a subcomponent of the Child Care Food Program. This program, designed primarily to provide nutritious meals and snacks to children in Emergency Shelters, is now available to the children of Community Partnership for Homeless. The children at both sites, The Chapman Center located at 1550 North Miami Avenue, and south Miami-Dade center located at 28205 SW 125th Avenue, Homestead, will receive the meals free of charge.

Approximately 57,240 meals, including breakfast, lunch, and dinner, will be served annually through this grant. It is estimated that 238 unduplicated children will be fed monthly at both centers. “This is a fantastic partnership,” said H. Daniel Vincent, executive director of Community Partnership for Homeless. “This grant represents approximately \$120,000 to our feeding program. We are very grateful to be working with the Children Food and Nutrition Program,” he said.
